Who can join band at RHS?

Any RHS student may find a role in the Marching Knights. The 125 members of the Marching Band must be enrolled in a band, orchestra, keyboard, or eurhythmics class.

Drumline members are selected during auditions in May. *All other percussionists become members of the Front-Ensemble.*

Starlets

The Starlets are the color and visual component of the Marching Band. These students perform with the band during the halftime show, in the stands, in parades, and during most band events. They are the band's "Color Guard."

As a competitive Marching Band the Starlets will be taught **choreography**, perform **dance**, **spin flag**, **spin rifle**, and **spin sabre** specific to our halftime show theme.

The Starlets perform **routines** in the stands during the football games and perform choreographed **dance routines** at School Pep Rallies.

The Starlets are enrolled in a co-curricular class called EURHYTHMICS. This is a graded class that meets after school. It has a county curriculum, semester exam, and provides a credit if taken the full year.

Starlets cont...

After Marching Band season, the Starlets transition into a Winterguard. This is an indoor performing ensemble that competes against other guards across the state. This aspect of the guard becomes separate from the band and is run as its own team.

Detailed information on Winterguard season will be presented in October.
